Caldwell LIVE is a federal demonstration program whose goal is to help older adults remain in the community. This non-sectarian program is in partnership with the Borough and local organizations. The Big Read is an initiative to restore reading to the center of American culture. Organizations selected to participate in The Big Read received grants ranging from \$5,000 to \$20,000 to promote and carry out community-based programs.
